

OSCEOLA COUNTY PULLERS GARDEN TRACTOR GENERAL RULES

If you bring a garden tractor we will find you a class to pull in. NO ONE WILL BE TURNED AWAY.

1. The 2012 rules are designed to provide for the orderly conduct of the garden tractor pulling events and to reduce the risk of injury to both participants and spectators. It is ultimately the obligation of each participant to ensure that his/her conduct and equipment comply with all applicable rules and regulations, as they may be amended from time to time. No express or implied warranty of safety shall result from the compliances with these rules. They are intended as a guide for the conduct of the sport and are in no way a guarantee against injury to pullers or spectators.
2. Contest is open to two wheel drive, rear wheel drive, rubber tired tractors. NO dual wheels, chains, studs or paddle tires permitted.
3. ALL drivers must be able to operate the tractor in a safe manner, be able to stop forward motion of their tractor at any given time with no assistance during their pull, from the starting flag to when they unhook. When you are flagged, your pull is over. All drivers must obey the flagman. All tractors must be switched off or placed in neutral, throttle returned to idle and driver's hand placed in the air to signal track workers it is safe to hook or unhook tractor from sled. Driver only- no passengers. Tractors are not to be left unattended while running.
4. Each tractor may be entered only once per class per driver. One pull per tractor unless he/she is test puller or a tie is declared. Each driver is allowed 2 attempts within the 25' mark. Second attempt is official.
5. The first official measured puller in each class has the option of accepting first pull or may decline and make a second pull. The first puller in each class will not lose their option in the event of sled change or sled reweigh.
6. All tractors must have working brakes capable of safely stopping machine.
7. Wheelie bars or skid plates mandatory on all tractors.
8. Mower attachments are not permitted.
9. Gasoline only- no alcohol or additives permitted.
10. All tractors must have working kill switch on back of tractor.
11. No portion of tractor may interfere with the sled or chain during pull. Chain and kill switch cord MUST be easily hooked without interference. No tractor may exceed 6' in width or extend more than 8' from back of tires.
12. All tractors must cross the scales for weight verification before pulling. All tractors must be kept in the staging area until pulling.
13. Weight bracket/weights may not extend behind the rear of the rear tire. All weights must be securely fastened. Weights lost while pulling will cause disqualification.
14. Driver must be seated and one hand must be on the steering wheel while tractor is in motion. No hot rodding on or off the track. Idle speed only in the pits.
15. All tractors not ready to hook when sled is spotted will be disqualified at the discretion of a track official.
16. No entries will be taken after the start of the class. Pulling positions will be determined by track officials.
17. Any part of the tractor going out of bounds or crossing the out of bounds line or puller flagged for any reason will stop the pull at that point. The flagman will make these determinations and is the final authority.

18. Note all winning tractors are subject to tech inspection.
19. No alcoholic beverages allowed.
20. All drivers must sign a waiver. Any driver under 18 must have a parent or legal guardian sign for them. Drivers 16 years of age or younger must be accompanied by an adult. Adult must be within proximity of the youth driver at all times, and be capable of shutting down the tractor in the event the youth becomes endangered.

21. All drivers must attend the drivers meeting before each pull.
22. Drivers must watch flagman at all times.
23. Anything not covered by these rules will be discussed and acted upon by officials. KVLS will address any controversy over rules. The Board's decision will be final.

YOUTH CLASS

Tractors must be 1000 lbs or under.
All drivers are to be 10 years of age or younger.
Stock tractor rules apply to this class.
Must pull in first gear.
Drawbar height 13" maximum.

FACTORY STOCK CLASS

Tractors can be 1 or 2 cylinder, 18hp and under engine with NO alterations.
Tractor must maintain original appearance.
No extended frame
No after market, adjustable pulleys allowed. MUST use stock gearing.
Clutches, belts, open drive shafts must be shielded same as factory.
All weights will be between rear and front tires.
No weight booms allowed.
Drawbar height 13" maximum.
No trailer balls.
Single and twins pull together. Maximum tire size 26x12x12. No cut tires or professional pulling tires.
Must run stock governor in working condition.
Can use clevis, must be mounted vertically.

MODIFIED CLASSES 1050lb, 1250lb

48' or smaller single cylinder engine
May have cut pulling tires
Hanging weights.
Max tire size is 26x12x12.
Stock appearing carburetor.
Tractor must use stock garden tractor frames.
Frames must maintain factory length.

SUPER MODIFIED CLASSES 1050lb, 1250lb

V twin up to 48 cubic inch motors and single cylinder motors 48 cubic inch or larger
May have cut pulling tires
Hanging weights.

Max tire size is 26x12x12.
Stock appearing carburetor.
Tractor must use stock garden tractor frames.
Frames must maintain factory length.

MINI RODS

Full gasoline, CAMII, or aviation fuel. No alcohol
5000 RPM limit
Must have roll cage
Driver must wear fire suit & helmet
Must have strap safety transmission blanket
Mandatory wheelie bars and kill switch
Weight classes: 1800 2000
General rules apply to all classes
31" tires maximum
